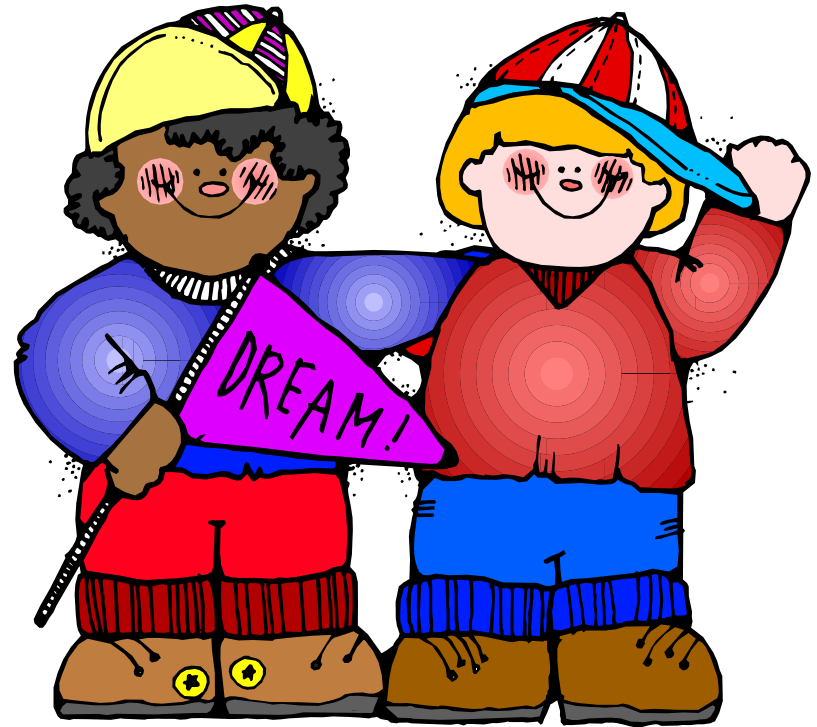
January - let us peer,

If his shadow happens to show,



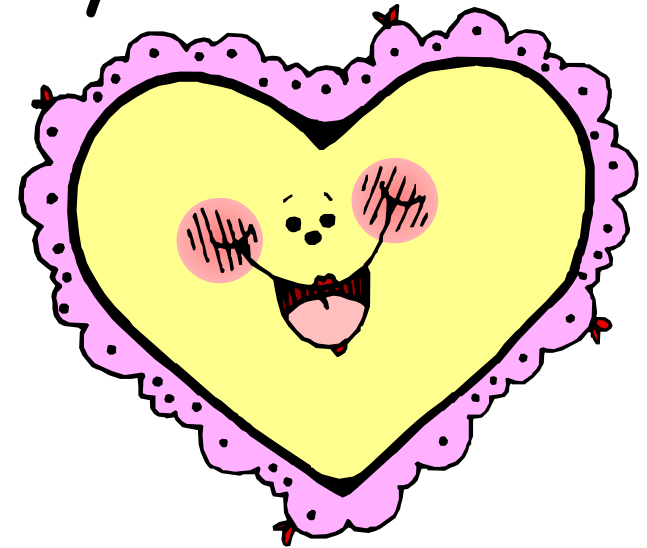

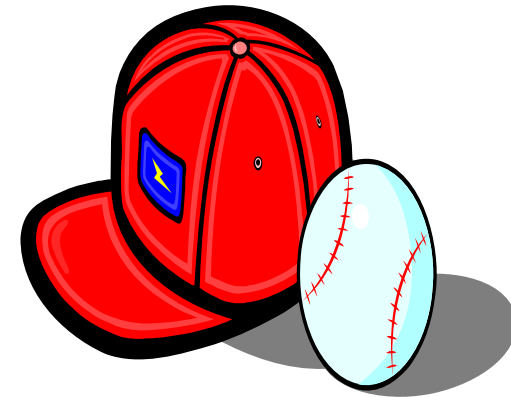

What are you planning to do?


On the 14th of this month,

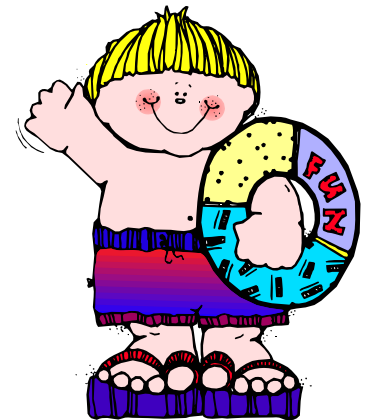

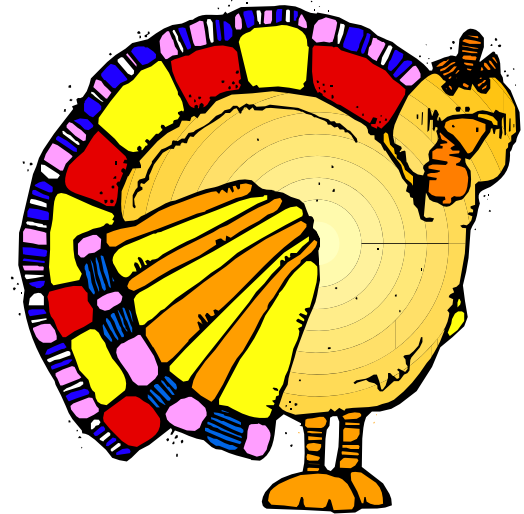

The year was 1621,

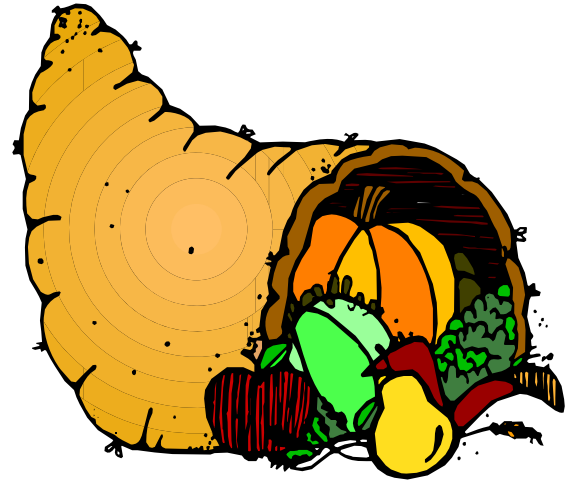

Gingerbread, pine, peppermints,

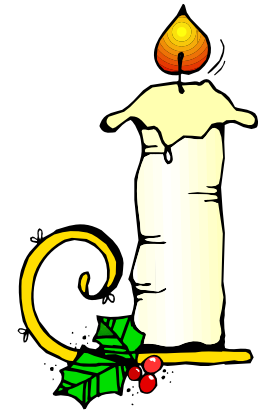
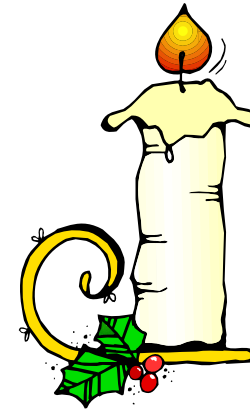
Lots of lovely Christmas scents.
